In 2019, New York employers are focused on ensuring that they are in compliance with New York State's newly enacted anti-sexual harassment laws that were passed in response to the #Metoo movement, Casa said.

"These new laws require all employers, regardless of size, to adopt and distribute an anti-sexual harassment policy to their employees on or before October 9, 2018," she explained.

"Additionally, all employers are required by law to provide their employees with annual interactive anti-harassment training by no later than

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October 9, 2019," Casa noted. "Employers with existing policies and training programs should review their materials to ensure compliance with the state's minimum standards."
